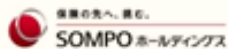

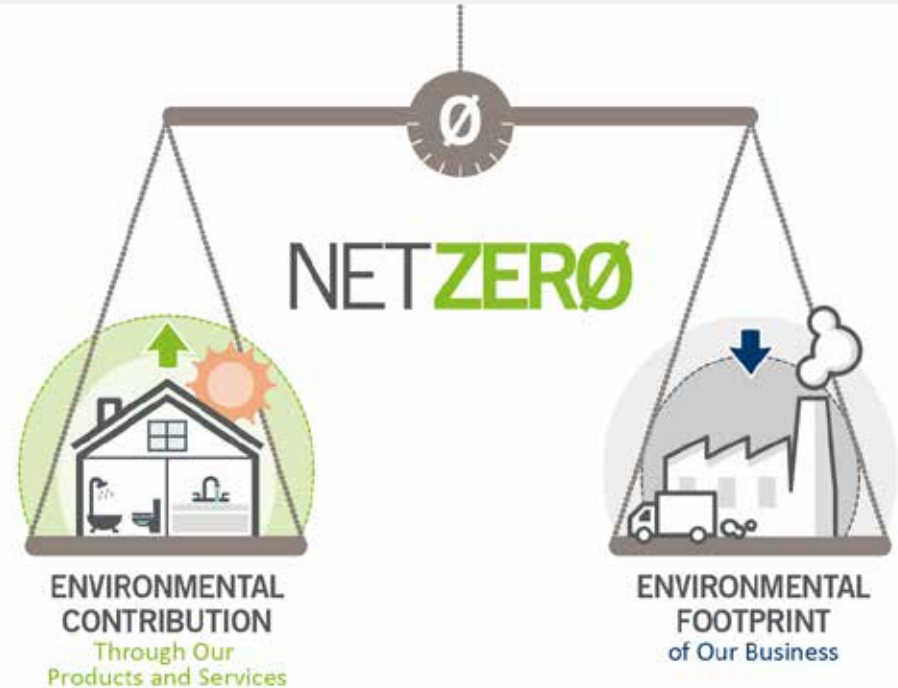

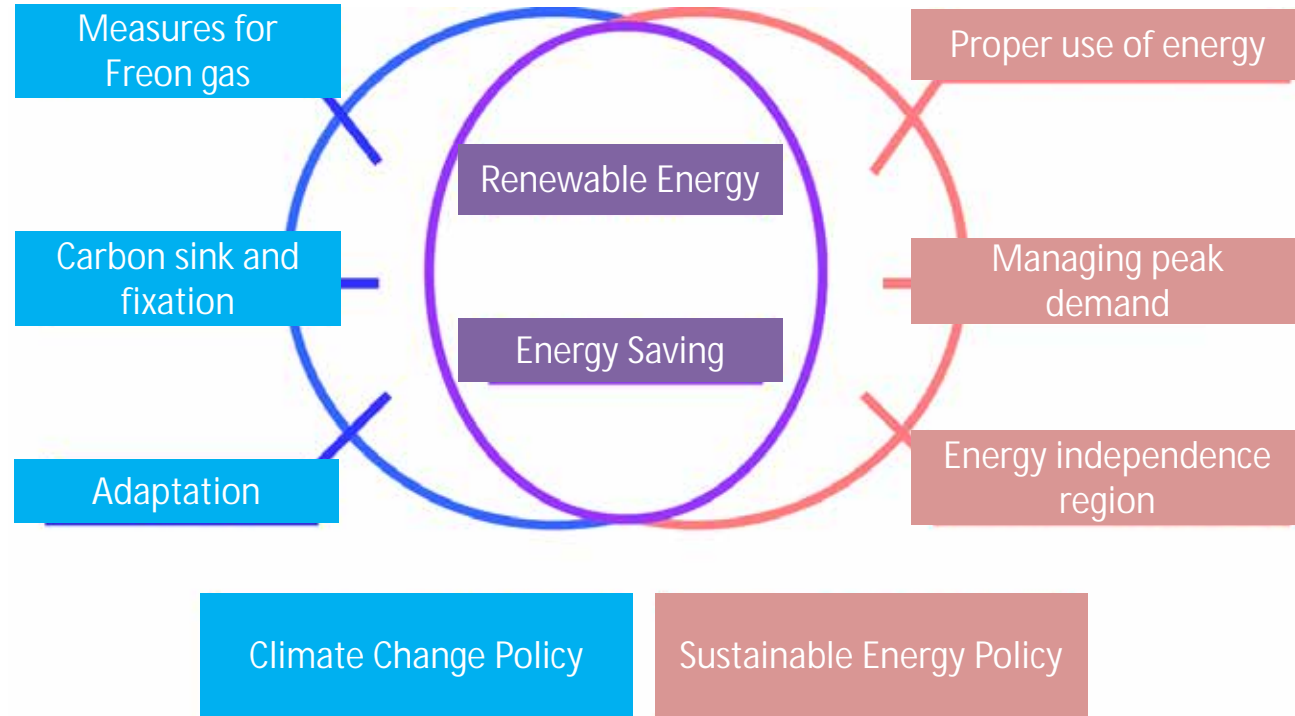

Nagano Prefecture aims at achieving a “100% renewable energy region” by promoting renewable energy and energy saving



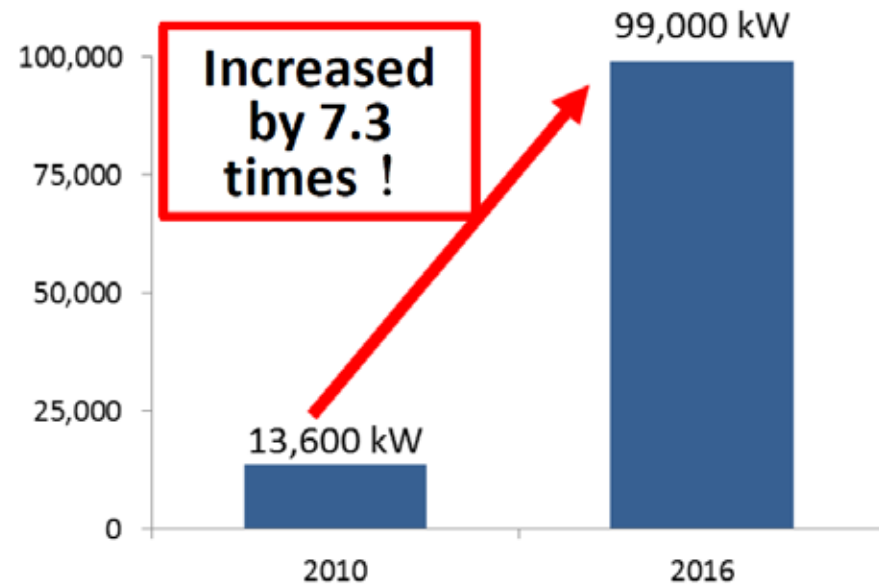
Itabashi Ward in Tokyo
